

BYLAW NO. 01-04

A BYLAW TO PROVIDE FOR THE DISPOSAL OF DOMESTIC
WASTE AND THE OPERATION OF A WASTE DISPOSAL GROUND

The Council of the Rural Municipality of Pense No. 160 in the
Province of Saskatchewan, Canada hereby enacts as follows:

1. In this Bylaw, the following definitions apply:
 - a) 'Council' means the Council of the Rural Municipality of Pense No. 160;
 - b) 'Designated Area(s)' means separate sites within the waste disposal grounds set aside for particular disposal i.e.: general waste, wood and metal;
 - c) 'General Waste' includes garbage, rubbish, scrap, discarded materials, bottles, cans, household waste and other waste products of any kind;
 - d) 'Metal' means large metallic objects such as major appliances, water heaters, stoves, furnaces, washers, dryers, refrigerators, deep freezers, dishwashers, bed springs, fencing, gates, etc.;
 - e) 'Municipality' means the Rural Municipality of Pense No. 160;
 - f) 'Public Highway' means a road allowance or a road, street, or lane, vested in the Crown in right of Saskatchewan or set aside for such purposes and includes the entry road to the waste disposal ground, a bridge, culvert, drain or other public improvement erected upon or in connection with such public highway;
 - g) 'Waste Disposal Ground' means the municipal waste disposal site located on Pt. SE 11-18-23 W2;
 - h) 'Wood' means trees, shrubs, stumps and branches.
2. All general waste, wood and metal shall be deposited in the designated areas of the waste disposal ground.
3. Chemical containers, dead animals, grain, cement, railway ties, tires, asphalt shingles, hazardous waste, petroleum by-products, liquid domestic sewage and wire of any description shall not be deposited at the waste disposal ground.
4. No person shall place, dump or dispose of any general waste, wood or metal in, near or over the gate or fence at the disposal ground, or on any public highway.
5. No person shall operate any vehicle transporting waste over any public highway unless the load is completely enclosed or covered with a tarpaulin or secured in such a manner that it shall be impossible for any part of the said load content to escape.
6. Absolutely no burning is allowed at the waste disposal ground unless carried out by the municipality or its representative and a permit or letter of approval is received from Sask. Environment.
7. No discharge of firearms is allowed at the waste disposal grounds.
8. No person shall deface, destroy or alter any signs, gates or fencing at the waste disposal ground.

9. Hours of operation of the waste disposal grounds are prescribed by resolution of Council. The hours of operation shall be posted at the waste disposal ground.
10. Load charges to be collected by a representative of the municipality are set out in Appendix "A" attached and posted at the waste disposal grounds.
11. Municipal employee(s) or representative(s) of the municipality may require any person entering the waste disposal ground to furnish any information required in the fulfillment of duties under this Bylaw.
12. Municipal employee(s) or representative(s) of the municipality may refuse to accept any substance, material or waste if, in the opinion of the municipal employee(s) or representative(s), such waste represents a risk to the health or safety of themselves or which may be detrimental to the environment.
13. Any person who contravenes any provisions of this Bylaw is guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction to the penalties imposed in the General Penalty Bylaw of the municipality.
